Key Roles and Responsibilities

- I founded The Eaton Foundation in memory of my Father in Law who died from drug and alcohol abuse in 2013. In this role, I have used my skills from TSO management, project management, policy writing and research to create the charity, register it with Charities Commission and successfully secure funding for the charity for the next six years. It has a current annual turnover of over £125,000 and employs 6 members of staff and 12 volunteers, supporting over 50 men per week.
- Chairperson and Founder for the charity and therefore hold the responsibility for all executive management decisions, finance, banking and HMRC and annual reports/returns.
- Responsible for securing all contracts, tenders, partnerships and grant funding – track record of winning over £700,000 of national and regional grants in the last 2 years.
- Created the 'You and Your Loved Ones' 2014 (and the Male Mental Health Survey 2015) which was circulated online and in hard copy to adults to collect quantitative and qualitative feedback from participants about their experiences of offending, dependency, poverty, homelessness and mental health issues in males in their families.
- The Eaton Foundation Training Services – Designing and delivering anti-gender stereotyping training and male mental health courses for Police, NHS, Council, LSCB, Housing Associations to increase self-gen funding and unrestricted funds/reserves.

- On the 7th September 2015, I launched the UK's first Male Mental Health Centre in Burton on Trent. Our large facility offers holistic support to men experiencing mental health issues, poverty, offending, homelessness, unemployment and dependency all in one place.
